Bangor, ME: We're on our way to ending hunger in Maine, and you can help! Katahdin Trust is pleased to partner with United Way of Eastern Maine and Good Shepherd Food Bank to serve as a collection point for the Pantry Project at our three Bangor area branches throughout the month of April. Our goal is to collect as many canned goods as we can to help those less fortunate in our local communities.

We believe that communities that work together, thrive together, and that's why we feel so strongly about doing our part in helping to keep food pantries full all year long," said Krista Putnam, Katahdin Trust Vice President, Marketing. Last year, Katahdin Trust employees, customers and other visitors collected 380 pounds of food. "We know there is a great need for support," says Putnam. "Our goal is to surpass last year's collection efforts."

More than 20% of Maine households do not have reliable and consistent access to food. Although the holiday season brings many donations of food, by spring, many pantries experience a food shortage. The current economy has forced more people into poverty or near poverty; with 1 in 4 children in Maine living in poverty.

"Since the project's inception in 2010, we have collected over **60,000 pounds** of food," shares Meredith Alexander, Community Impact Manager for United Way of Eastern Maine. "Our goal in 2018 is to collect 15,000 pounds of food, which will provide over 12,000 meals to families in need in our communities."
