Our employees were very pleased to contribute to such a worthwhile organization.”

Katahdin Trust employees can dress casually on the second Friday of each month in support of various non-profit organizations throughout Maine. Each employee that participates in Casual Because We Care Days donates a minimum of \$1 in exchange for the privilege to dress casually and wear jeans. Proceeds are sent quarterly to a pre-selected non-profit organization.

“Camp CaPella never turns away a camper based on ability to pay,” explains Heidi Riggs, Camp Director. “This can be a challenge. For the past few years we’ve seen a consistency in that 60% of our campers cannot afford to pay anything for camp. Donations like this, from the employees of Katahdin Trust, can help fill that void. And the support from local businesses means so much to all of us at camp.”
