



Katahdin Trust and United Way of Aroostook Continue Literacy Partnership

Presque Isle, ME (04/19/2019) - United Way of Aroostook is excited to announce it will once again partner with Katahdin Trust Company to offer all first graders throughout Aroostook County a backpack with free books to read over the summer. Known as "The Summer Slide," the program encourages early readers to continue reading throughout the summer to keep their reading skills sharp and to strengthen their reading fluency. This is the fourth year United Way of Aroostook has coordinated the program and the third year

working with Katahdin Trust.

Summer Slide works with schools to provide first graders with some tools to prevent the loss of reading skills over the summer months. School administrators throughout Aroostook have already received and responded positively to a letter of invitation to participate in the program. Katahdin Trust volunteers will help United Way to deliver the books to each participating school in late May/early June. Backpacks will be provided to the children at no cost to them or their family. Each pack will contain three books, some activities, and other materials. Activities enclosed in the backpack will help children to engage with the books they were given.

This year a book about saving money will be included in Brian Martin, Lakeisha St. John, and Amy Turner. all backpacks to encourage young people to begin the good habit of saving money for the things they want and need. A money related activity will also be given to each child in hopes that math skills will be practiced along with reading.
